1:1 Consultation Lessons in singing & acting take place at lunch and after timetabled classes.

Welcome Reception

On the first day of the course, we will hold a welcome reception for all of our summer school participants in the bar area from 17.30-19.00. It is a great opportunity to meet everyone in a relaxed setting so please come along after your first day of classes.

What to Wear and What to Bring

Clothes: Please wear clothes you feel comfortable moving in. We recommend you bring multiple layers so you can add/remove layers as needed. To ensure your safety and the safety of others, we ask that you don't wear jewellery in the studio.

Footwear: Participants should expect to do all other classes in bare feet. Participants may wear non marking white soled trainers (indoor shoes only). Please note, tap shoes are not permitted.

Please bring:

- Comfortable clothes you feel able to move in
- A water bottle
- A straw for vocal exercises.
- Either: an Oyster Card, a contactless payment card or a pre-paid train ticket. This will be used to travel via public transport to the Theatre Visit. More information about the theatre visit will be released nearer to the time.
- Some of your classes will work on songs and monologues. Please bring:
 - o 2 printed copies of a short monologue (up to 1.5 minutes)
 - o 2 printed copies of a short solo Musical Theatre song (up to 2 minutes).

Please bring printed copies of the sheet music. One copy should be taped together for the accompanist. If you also have a backing track, you can bring this too but it's not necessary.

Helpful tips for choosing your song/monologue:

- can be in any Musical Theatre style (e.g. Contemporary, Pop, Rock etc.)
- should demonstrate a clear emotional journey and allow you to act through song
- should be in your comfortable vocal range. Consider your casting type. Could you see yourself playing this character?
- if your song is longer than two minutes and you are not able to write cuts into the sheet music, please select a verse and chorus
- choose material you might use for an audition
- you should have rehearsed your choice and know it well

Accommodation

Accommodation bookings are optional. If you do decide to book accommodation with us, it is located in the McMillan Student Village just a 5-minute walk away from the Laban Building. Please visit our [website](#) for more information.

As part of the Musical Theatre Summer School, you will attend a West End performance. Students must have a contactless payment card, Oyster Card or pre-paid train ticket in advance of trip. More information about the trip will be released nearer to the time.

Please ensure you check the Musical Theatre Summer School noticeboard each day to stay up to date over the course, which will be pointed out on the tour of the building. Updates may include studio/staffing changes and signup sheets for additional activities.

Leaving the course/accommodation early

Some international participants may have to leave early to catch a flight, but we recommend that you time your journeys so that you don't miss anything. There is an informal showcase on the last day of the course and it's a great chance to perform what you've been working on and celebrate your time at the summer school together.

Can visitors or parents watch the Musical Theatre Summer School sessions or sharing?

Friends and family are welcome to watch the informal showcase on the final day of the Summer School. Due to studio capacity, seats are limited to a maximum of 2 guests per Summer School participant. Please allow time to sign in at reception upon arrival to the informal showcase.

All other Summer School sessions are closed to non-participants. Throughout the Summer School, all friends and family must remain in the public areas of the Laban Building, i.e. the cafe, and will not be permitted to pass the security barriers.

More information about the timings of the Informal Showcase will be released nearer the time.

Changing rooms and showers

Changing rooms and showers are available for all participants to use. If you wish to shower you will need to bring a towel with you. Trinity Laban is not responsible for the loss of any items.

Internet Access

You will be able to connect to Trinity Laban visitor Wi-Fi whilst in the building. If you are staying at the McMillan Student Village you will be able to access Wi-Fi there also.

Laban Building Café

Food is not provided as part of the Summer School but the Café at the Laban Building sells a range of food including hot lunches, salads, sandwiches and snacks. You are welcome to bring your own food to eat in the café too if you prefer.

There are water fountains available throughout the building to help you stay hydrated.

Health and Wellbeing

Where possible please let us know in advance if you have any medical conditions or other access requirements that we need to be aware of.

Please let your teacher know if you have any injuries which they should be aware of. If you sustain an injury or feel unwell at any point during the course, please let a member of the Summer School team know as soon as possible. There are First Aiders on site throughout the course. The Summer School is fun but can be physically demanding, so we have programmed morning and lunch breaks to enable participants to rest properly.

Late-comers Policy for Classes

For health and safety reasons, participants who arrive later than 15 minutes after the start of each session may be permitted to watch the session but not take part. This is because they will have missed the essential warm up and introduction to the session, which is vital in the prevention of injuries to participants.

Ventilation

The air in the Laban Building is supplied via air handling units which draw air in from outside, filter it and heats/cool it accordingly. It is then removed via a separate extract system. This system provides complete air changes to each area of the building including the studios, every 15 minutes. We do not recirculate any air within the building. For optimal studio ventilation at the Laban Building, it is best to ensure doors remain closed.

Covid-19

We will continually monitor and assess COVID-19 guidance and measures that would be relevant to the Summer School in the lead up to and during the course. If you begin to experience Covid-19 symptoms, please follow the UK Government's guidance and do not attend activities at Trinity Laban.
