The Body Remembers Itself

This solo is a body remembering how to become. Guided by Sandra Reeve's "Nine Ways of Seeing a Body", it traces a journey of learning through change, resistance, and release. Reeve states that the nine lenses she has presented are the fruit of her investigation into the way we view and inhabit our bodies.

The nine lenses are as follows: the body as object and as subject; the phenomenological, somatic, and contextual bodies; the interdependent, environmental and cultural bodies; and, finally, the ecological body.

These lenses served as a research framework which I used to immerse myself in during my work placements with two wonderful youth groups here at Laban. Each working moment with a lens became a tool for creation. I invite the audience to witness not just a body in motion, but a body transforming as I move between ways of seeing, being seen, and seeing myself.

This piece is a reflection of what I witnessed and what was revealed to me. It is a thank-you to those young people who taught me as much as I taught them. And to Dr. Liz Fort, my supervisor, who has inspired me to step into this industry - even if I am scared of what it asks of me. Thank you for walking beside me as I learn to become.
