This project explores 'Rotting Home', a performance communicating the lived experience of endometriosis through movement. Developed from improvisational tasks, the piece draws on the language used by myself and others to describe endometriosis, artwork that resonated with my condition, the embodied memory of the pain sensations and how I navigate life as a woman living with this. My aim was to become a living image of my suffering, creating a human connection through the universal experience of pain, grasp an understanding of which areas of my life the condition holds power, while educating the audience about endometriosis.

The piece challenges power, perception, femininity and sensuality, whilst following my journey of discovery of what it means to be a woman with endometriosis. Themes include:

- Power of pain
- Power of the male gaze
- Power of the medical field
- Power of the female voice
- The power of endo's invisible community

A special thanks to my dad. For further research, I wanted to expand my ability to communicate my story, so my dad and I decided to collaborate through expressive art. I performed a durational version of my piece, whilst he observed and painted his interpretation. We were left with a visual representation of a daughter trying to communicate her pain to her father.
